1. Introduction

The South African Warmblood Horse Society (SAWHS) is the governing body for Warmblood horses in South Africa, operating under the **Registrar of Animal Improvement** within the South African Agricultural Department.

The South African Warmblood (SAW) is a specialized sport horse recognized for its excellence in Showjumping, Dressage, and Eventing. All SAW horses registered with the SAWHS bear the "SAW" designation.

This guide provides a comprehensive overview of the **inspection and registration process**, including requirements, categories, fees, and procedures.

2. Inspection Eligibility & Requirements

Before presenting a horse for inspection, the following conditions must be met:



- The owner must be a **paid-up member** of SAWHS.
- The horse must be **recorded** with SAWHS, with DNA and/or microchip information on file.
- All **inspection fees** must be settled **before** scheduling the inspection.
- Horses must meet the **minimum height requirements**:
 - Mares: Minimum 15.1hh (1.55m) (preferred height 16hh+)
 - Stallions: Minimum 15.3hh (1.60m) (preferred height 16.1hh+)
- Horses must be at least 3 years old for inspection.
- 3. Types of Inspections
- 3.1 General Inspections (Mares & Geldings)
 - In-hand presentation assessing the horse's conformation, movement, and suitability as a South African Warmblood.
 - Minimum height requirement: **15.1hh for mares**.
 - Thoroughbreds & Anglo Arabs must score 70% or higher to qualify.
 - If a horse scores below **65%**, it will be placed in the **Pre-Register**.
 - Fee: R900 (August 2024 July 2025).



3.2 First Acceptance (Young Stallions)

- For stallions aged **3 to under 5 years old**, focusing on **breeding specialization** (jumping or dressage).
- Assessment includes:
 - In-hand movement (halt, walk, trot).
 - Loose jump evaluation (for showjumping stallions).
 - Minimum pass mark: 70% to achieve First Acceptance.
- Fee: R1,800 (August 2024 July 2025).
- Status is valid for **four years**. If the stallion is not presented for **Full License within this time**, its status reverts to **Inspected horse**.
- 3.3 Full Stallion License
 - The final licensing assessment includes:
 - In-hand & conformation assessment.
 - Under-saddle test in walk, trot, and canter.
 - Jumping evaluation (1m course for young stallions; higher for experienced stallions).
 - Outside rider evaluation (where possible).
 - Minimum pass mark: 75% for licensing; 65% for Inspected Status.
 - Fee: R4,300 (August 2024 July 2025).



4. Inspection Presentation Guidelines

4.1 Handler Attire

- Handlers must dress neatly and practically.
- Running shoes are recommended for mobility.
- Grooms should not wear overalls.
- 4.2 Horse Presentation
 - **Coat:** Clean and well-groomed, free of bot eggs and stable stains.
 - Ears & Whiskers: Not to be trimmed (in line with FEI regulations).
 - Mane: Must be plaited, pulled, or neatly trimmed.
 - Hooves: Must be well-maintained, trimmed, or shod.
 - Tail: Must be clean, neatly cut, and straight (banged). Tail plaits are permitted.

5. Premium Status for Mares

Premium status can be awarded to mares in the Full Warmblood Register, Secondary Register, and Coloured Warmblood Register based on:



- Achieving 80% or higher in inspection (PR designation).
- Competing at the **highest levels** in sport (**PRj**, **PRd**, **or PRx** designation).
- Producing successful progeny (PRp designation).
- Owners must **apply** for premium status upgrades.
- 6. DNA & Registration Requirements
 - All horses require DNA testing. Owners must submit:
 - Mane hair sample with follicles.
 - The **DNA form**, available on the SAWHS website.
 - Foal Birth Notifications must be submitted within the first year.
 - Cost: **R375 (members)**.
 - Requires a covering certificate signed by the vet/stallion owner.
 - Late Recording (horses over 1 year old) incurs a higher fee (R600).



7. Approved Warmblood Studbooks

SAWHS recognizes horses registered with approved **European Warmblood studbooks**, including:

- Belgian Warmblood (BWP, SBS)
- Danish Warmblood (DWB)
- Dutch Warmblood (KWPN)
- German Studbooks (Hannoverian, Holstein, Oldenburg, Westfalen, Trakehner, etc.)
- Swedish (SWB), Swiss (ZVCH, CHS), French (SF), Zangersheide (ZANG), Irish Sport Horse (ISH, RID)
- Approved Thoroughbreds & Anglo Arabs

Note: ZfDP and AES are NOT automatically accepted.
